Free and Discount Options

- » Many municipalities provide free passes to residents with financial need. Contact your municipal office today to see if you qualify.
- Don't forget to ask for a transfer! Most transit agencies provide free or discounted same-day transfers to routes operated by other agencies. When exiting, make sure to ask the driver for a transfer pass.

Bus & Buy

- » Hannaford Biddeford, spend \$25 and get two free Shuttlebus-ZOOM passes.
- » Hannaford Sanford, spend \$25 to receive two tokens redeemable on Sanford Transit.
- At most Hannaford and Shaw's stores served by METRO, riders get a transfer stamped at checkout for a free trip.

Can't use transit because of a disability?

You may qualify for door-to-door service. The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requires public transit agencies to provide "complementary paratransit" service to people with disabilities who cannot use the fixed-route bus, rail or ferry service because of a disability. In general, paratransit service operates at the same hours and days. To find out if you or someone you know is eligible, contact the paratransit agency in your county.






RTP SHOPPER SHUTTLES

CUMBERLAND COUNTY

RTP operates weekday shopper shuttles throughout Cumberland County to help people access food. The shuttles run between the locations below and nearby supermarkets. Rides are \$2.50 each way or free to income eligible riders. To schedule a ride, call RTP at 207-774-2666 or 1-800-244-0704. Rides must be arranged two days in advance and riders must complete an application. The map below shows pick-up locations in Portland, Westbrook, and South Portland, but RTP also provides townwide door-to-door shuttle service in Scarborough, Bridgton, Naples, and Casco.

BIKES FOR ALL MAINERS



About

Bikes for All Mainers is a partnership between the Bicycle Coalition of Maine, the Portland Gear Hub, and MaineDOT. The program provides an opportunity for adults who do not have financial access to bikes, are undocumented or recent immigrants, or live in communities under-served by public transit, to acquire basic bike mechanic skills, learn to bike safely on Maine roadways, volunteer in their communities, and overcome some of their transportation challenges.

Details

- » Open to anyone 18 or older who is able to safely ride a bicycle.
- » Sliding scale fee of \$25-50. Fee waiver request available.
- » Those who complete the program earn a refurbished bike, helmet, lock, lights, and saddle bag filled with tools and accessories.
- » Location: The program is run out of the Portland Gear Hub, location details and contact information to the right.

PORTLAND GEAR HUB AND BIKE SCHOOL



About

The Gear Hub sells reused bicycles (along with other outdoor gear) and offers bike repairs. The Bike School offers open bench time, at a sliding scale, and classes in bike repair and maintenance for youth and adults. Proceeds support youth and adult educational programming at the shop and at Camp Ketcha.

ABOUT THIS GUIDE

This resource guide was developed by the Greater Portland Council of Governments (GPCOG) in collaboration with the Transportation and Community Well-Being Network and the Southern Maine Planning and Development Commission (SMPDC).

GPCOG strengthens the cities and towns of Greater Portland and the Lakes Region by providing excellent, responsive services and leading the region toward sustainable prosperity. GPCOG offers planning and municipal services to its 26 member municipalities. GPCOG also houses the Metropolitan Planning Organization for the region, the Portland Area Comprehensive Transportation System, or PACTS, which includes 18 Cumberland and York County towns and cities.

Founded in 1964, in response to an identified need for a coordinated effort for economic development and resource management, **SMPDC** has been conducting economic development, environmental, land use and transportation planning and providing technical assistance to the municipalities in the region for 50 years. A council of governments enabled by state statute, SMPDC includes 39 communities in York, Oxford, and Cumberland Counties.

The Transportation and Community Well-Being Network was launched by GPCOG in 2017 with funding from the National Center for Mobility Management. The Network focuses on improving transportation access and options for people who experience barriers. The Network is responding to the need for greater coordination by intentionally connecting stakeholders across sectors including human services, aging and disability organizations, health care and public health, transportation agencies, and individuals with lived experience of transportation barriers. After assessing transportation needs through a roundtable event and an assessment survey, the Network chose to focus on three goals:

- 1. Coordination to address gaps and improve access
- 2. Advocacy to raise awareness among decision-makers
- 3. Sharing information and solutions within the Network and beyond
