The Trails

Quarry Trail Loop — Overall flat, although steep in sections. 2 miles out and back. Head left or right on Universal Access Trail, follow blue blazes from the top of the field.

Universal Access Trail (name TBD) — 1/2 mile, open for walking, rated for wheeled mobility devices. Benches, interpretive signage, and trail markers coming soon!

Designated Uses

- Hiking and nature observation
- Snowshoeing and cross country skiing
- Hunting
- ATV & Snowmobile on designated trails

Use Guidelines

- Carry in, carry out
- Stay on marked trails
- No campfires or camping
- Keep pets under control at all times
- Do not disturb wildlife and plant life
- No motorized vehicles beyond parking areas
- Wheeled mobility devices and strollers allowed on the Universal Access Trail

From Rt 302, heading south, turn right onto Rt 117 (Sandy Creek Rd). Turn left onto Rt 107 (South Bridgton Rd). Head South on Rt 107 for 9.7mi to Ingalls Rd. Turn Right onto Ingalls Rd to Narramissic Rd (1.2mi). Follow Narramissic Rd until the end, turn right to enter parking area.

About Narramissic

The Peabody-Fitch Farm was established in 1797 by one of Bridgton's first settlers, William Peabody. In 1938, Mrs. Margaret Monroe from Providence, RI, purchased Peabody-Fitch Farm to use as a summer home. When she passed away in 1986, she left the farm & fields to the Bridgton Historical Society. Today, the property, known as Narramissic, is operated as a museum by Bridgton Historical Society. The house, barn, and blacksmith shop reflect life in the mid-19th century.






